

A Life in Football & Lessons Learned

Jack Harbaugh was born in Crestline, Ohio and attended Crestline High School where he lettered in football, baseball and basketball. As a senior Jack was all-state quarterback and short-stop. Jack played college football at Bowling Green from 1957-60. In Jack's junior season, Bowling Green went 9-0 and was named the small college division national champion.

After a brief stint in professional football in 1961, Jack began coaching high school football. In 1967 Jack began his long career as a college football coach. Jack was an assistant coach under Bo



Schembechler from 1973-79. From 1982-86 Jack was head coach at Western Michigan, and from 1989-2002, Jack was head coach at Western Kentucky. In Jack's last year at Western Kentucky, his team won the NCAA Division 1-AA championship.

In addition to Jack's long and successful coaching career, he and his wife, Jackie, have three children, a daughter and two sons. The sons, John and Jim, were successful athletes and have become successful head football coaches. John coaches the NFL Baltimore Ravens, and Jim is now at his alma mater, Michigan. Jack has embraced and propagated to his sons the adage: "Attack each day with an enthusiasm unknown to mankind."

How GTO Proceeds are Used in the Community and Around the World



The Rotary Club of Ann Arbor provides the funding and resources necessary to support a broad range of humanitarian efforts close to home and farther afield.

A central goal is to support young people, particularly those whose future development is impaired by physical, cultural, emotional, financial and social obstacles. Called "Helping Kids Succeed," the program actively solicits applications and awards grants to local-area non-profit organizations.



The Golf and Tennis Outing (GTO) event has enabled the Club to fund numerous successful efforts for children and families throughout Washtenaw County. Examples of such efforts are the Universal Access Playground located in Gallup Park, Touch A Truck, which is a literacy-health initiative to have every child be prepared for school, and "Service Above Self" scholarships for students who attended Ann Arbor area high schools and are enrolled at Washtenaw Community College.

In addition, annual grants totaling \$60,000 to \$75,000 are made to approximately a dozen community non-profits to assist their efforts to serve youth at risk.

The Club also works to identify, develop and carry out humanitarian projects with other Rotary Clubs as partners in developing countries. Recent projects include: providing clean water to thousands in Ghana and India, solar electricity to clinics in Niger and a school in Guatemala, malaria prevention in Zambia, agricultural development and women's empowerment in Sierra Leone and public health programs in Haiti.

The GTO event provides a substantial percentage of the Club's Community Service revenue, on par with support from the membership and distribution from the Club's foundation.
