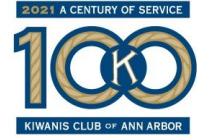

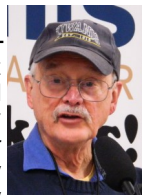

Karl was a member of our club in the 1990s but retired from his Kiwanis membership when his law practice at the Pear Sperlum firm located at Dominos Farms made attending weekly club luncheons difficult. Karl is a co-founder of The Dexter Forum and remains a leader in the Forum and in the Dexter community.*

*"Barbara Fuller began her career as a dental hygienist in 1974. In 1977 she earned a Bachelor of Science in Occupational Teacher Education from the University of Michigan. She is a Past President of the Michigan Dental Hygienists' Association. She has been a resident of Washtenaw County and Sharon Township for 52 years. She was a charter member of the Manchester Lions Club and served as Treasurer.*

*She became a Democratic Party activist in 1985 starting as an intern then legislative aide to Lana Pollack. She has managed both primary and general election races ranging from village president to U.S. senate. She staffed the first leg of the 1988 Medicaid funding of abortion ballot question and the successful 2003 greenbelt millage campaign in the City of Ann Arbor. She was co-founder and director of MI List, a statewide donor network for women.*

*Previously she has served on many public service boards: Pittsfield Township Deputy Supervisor, Washtenaw County Broadband Task Force chair, Washtenaw County Criminal Justice Collaborative Council, Washtenaw County Board of Canvassers chair, and the Washtenaw Community College Foundation Women's Council, chair.*

*She is currently serving on the Washtenaw County Board of Road Commissioners, 13 years as a member, five years as chair. This includes service on the County parks and recreation commission. Also the Michigan Broadband cooperative and alliance VP, and the Michigan Women's Foundation Grants Distribution Committee.*

*She is married to Nelson Fuller and has two adult children. She lives in Sharon Township near the village of Manchester. Barbara is a proven public servant."*

### Gordon Beeman Introduced Norman Herbert

**Norman Herbert** currently serves as director and co-chair of the Treeline Conservancy Board, which is developing an urban greenway through Ann Arbor beginning near the Huron River to the north and ending near Michigan Stadium to the south.

Norman was part of the financial management team for the University of Michigan for thirty-five years and served as treasurer of the University, charged with the management of the University's endowment and its working capital among other major responsibilities. It was at the University that I got to know Norman through my work as associate general counsel. I came to know Norman as a man of the highest integrity and trustworthiness; someone who got things done, and we had fun in the process.

Norman served as director and treasurer of the Washtenaw Community College Foundation, board chair of the University Musical Society, and chair and treasurer of the Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation. Norman has been active in leadership roles with financial, professional, civic, and non-profit organizations that are too numerous to mention. But I probably should add that Norman has been president and treasurer of the Ann Arbor Rotary Club and remains active in its leadership today.

### Jerry Brown Introduced Richard Lundy

**Richard (Dick) Lundy** graduated from the University of Michigan with a degree in Electrical engineering. He founded a company in 1972 and was President and CEO until 1999 when it was sold. The company designed and built computer-based test systems for the automobile industry. It was in Dexter from 1974 until the early 2000s and employed up to 80 people.

Dick was a member of the Dexter Kiwanis Club from 1978 until it dissolved in 2010. Dick's service on several community and non-profit boards of directors has given him valuable understanding and insight into the governance of these organizations. He was on the following non-profit boards: Ann Arbor Hands on Museum, Washtenaw United Way, United

Methodist Retirement Communities (1983 to the present), Silver Maples of Chelsea, Huron Valley Ambulance (1986 to the Present), Dexter Downtown Development Authority, Scio Township Downtown Development Authority, Michigan From the Heart which coordinates UM student athletes visits with patients at Mott Hospital (2000 to the present), Dexter United Methodist Church (1973 to the present), and Dexter Community Foundation. He also was a Dexter School Board Trustee and oversaw eight major capital (building) projects from 1979 to the present.

Dick and his family have been part of the Dexter Community since the late 1960s. Quality education for children is his priority. He was married to his wife, Ellen, for 45 years until she passed away in 2009. As a parent and grandparent, he has been very active in several hands-on programs in the Dexter Schools. Dick Lundy is the epitome of community service.

### Doug Ziesemer Introduced Ingrid Sheldon

**Ingrid Sheldon** is a native Ann Arborite with a lifetime of service to the community. She married late husband and Hall of Honor Kiwanian, Cliff Sheldon, in 1966. Her community service activities beginning in the 1970s include: project worker, board member, and president Jaycee Women; Thurston Elementary PTO Chair; Thurston Players original cast member, producer/chair (once); City Republican Party volunteer, Cub Scout leader; Girl Scout troop cookie sale chair; Sunday school teacher (1974-2004); Clague PTO vice president; and Ann Arbor AAUW vice president.

In the 1980s she was appointed to the joint city/school Recreation Advisory Commission by Mayor Lou Belcher. She served as the SOS Community Crises Center board treasurer; served on the Ann Arbor Public Schools Excellence Committee; and was elected to Ann

Arbor City Council, serving two terms (1988-1992). In the 1990s she joined Rotary, later serving as the Endowment Treasurer in 2003 and president in 2005-06. She also began involvement with the Ann Arbor Thrift Shop in 1992 and was president in 2014. She was elected Ann Arbor Mayor in 1993 and served four terms to 2000. She was Michigan Municipal League president in 1999.

Ingrid's activities through the 2000s to present include: Ann Arbor Summer Festival board chair, Ann Arbor Community Foundation board member, Eastern Michigan University Foundation trustee, and First United Methodist Church Finance Committee member. Among her many awards and honors are the Ann Arbor Jaycees Distinguished Service Award, Ann Arbor Rotary Community Service Award, Eastern Michigan University Distinguished Alumni Award, Cleary College Honorary Doctorate, Washtenaw United Way Heart of Gold Award, Washtenaw Habitat for Humanity Golden Hammer Award, and the Washtenaw County Bar Association Liberty Bell Award. Ingrid Sheldon can truly be called "Mrs. Ann Arbor!"

Several Kiwanians have long histories with our Club. **Max Ziegler** is one of them: sixty years of membership in 2027. **Nick Dever** has been a member for fifty-two years. But **Sallie Springer** has been part of the Kiwanis Rummage/Thrift Sale since the 1950s! And she has an interesting history.

Sallie lived at North Lake and attended elementary school there. She came to Ann Arbor, however, for junior high and high school. She attended Slauson Junior High and Ann Arbor High School, and graduated in 1952. By then, Sheridan Springer was part of Sallie's life, and they were boyfriend and girlfriend. We have a picture of Sallie back in those days. Max Ziegler thought that Sheri's dad, Walt Springer, was a Kiwanian and recruited both Sheri and Sallie to help with the Rummage Sale. In those days the Rummage Sale was held

once a year in the old Armory on Ann Street. Shari was big and strong and was put to work moving furniture into the building for the Sale. Sallie remembers making and selling hotdogs.

Sallie and Sheridan were married in 1955. Except for two years in the service in Germany, the couple settled down here, and Sheri joined Kiwanis in 1959. The Board was meeting in their living room when the decision was made to buy the building downtown. There is a picture of that meeting in the archives.

Sallie has been a faithful volunteer for 70 years! She worked in practically every department downtown and was the women's chairperson one year. Their three daughters, Sherry, Shelley, and Shannon also helped at the Sales. They would sell puppies and kittens that had been donated.

Sallie continues to volunteer today. She says, "It's part of my life, it gets me out of the house, and I see my friends." What a tribute to the value of volunteering. And what a treasure to have Sallie among us with her good spirit and kind heart. Welcome to Kiwanis, Sallie. We are pleased to induct you as an Honorary Member of the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor.

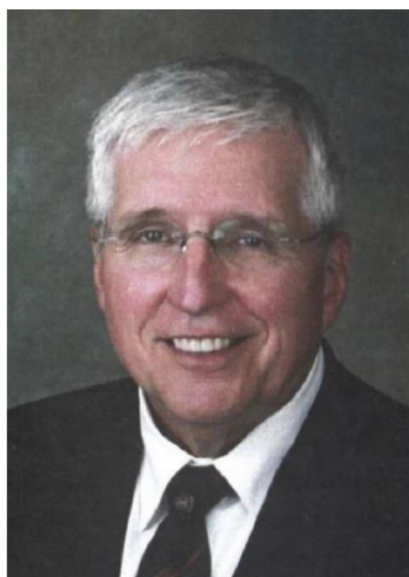
